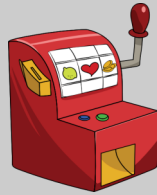

Are You an "APOLOGIST" You probably are...

Going beyond what the bishop previously said, listen to what Scripture says: In 1 Peter 3:15, the author tells us, "Always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who calls you to account for the hope that is in you." *Always* be prepared! The bishop in his column simply was echoing what God says to us through the sacred author of Scripture: We must be prepared to defend our faith. God would *not* tell us to do something that we are incapable of doing.

Why is it so important that we be able to defend our faith? Because it contains the fullness of God's revealed truth—our faith and only our faith. There is truth in other creeds, but not the fullness of truth that is contained in the Catholic faith. Therefore, we must be equipped to explain and defend it so that others may come to believe in the truth—the whole truth.

In 1 Timothy 2:4 we read, "[God] desires all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth." In John 8:32, "And you will know the truth and the truth will make you free." God desires that all people know the truth, and people need to know the truth to be set free. God desires that all people be saved, and He wants you and me to participate in that process. What will your response be?

Donation Requests

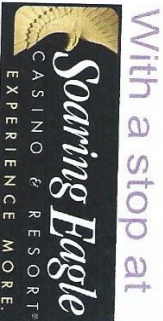
