

The History of Columbus Day

WHAT IS COLUMBUS DAY?

Columbus Day is a federal U.S. holiday that commemorates the voyage and landing of Italian explorer **Christopher Columbus** in the New World on October 12, 1492.

The anniversary of his landing in the New World was first formally celebrated in 1792, by the Columbian Order (Society of St. Tammany) in New York City.

WHEN IS COLUMBUS DAY?

Columbus Day is celebrated on the second Monday in October.

On October 12, 1492, Columbus landed on a small island in the Bahamas, convinced that he had reached his destination of Asia. Although he was not the first European to discover the Americas (Vikings, among others, had visited before), his journey sparked enthusiasm for European exploration of the hemisphere. h year. This means that the date changes each year.

The first celebration of Columbus's landing in the New World took place in 1792. It was organized by the Columbian Order (Society of St. Tammany) in New York City. In 1937, the occasion was declared a national holiday by President Franklin D. Roosevelt. Columbus Day has been observed on the second Monday of October since 1971. Many celebrate Italian-American heritage on this day.

The observance of Columbus Day is not without controversy. European exploration brought disease and devastation to the lives of the indigenous people of the Americas. Some areas of the United States choose to honor Native American culture on this day instead. Since 1992, this state and city holiday has been referred to as **Indigenous Peoples' Day**.

History is multifaceted. Columbus Day also speaks to the thirst for adventure, exploration, and possibilities that embodies the spirit of America. Columbus represents many early explorers and dreamers who reached for opportunity and not only dreamed, but acted.

There are three types of apologetics: natural apologetics, Christian apologetics, and Catholic apologetics. Martignoni's local bishop, in one of his regular columns in the local diocesan newspaper, once wrote. "There comes a time when we, as Catholics, have to be able to defend and explain certain teachings of our Catholic faith, *our faith is based on reason and logic*. The explanation of what we believe and why we believe it is called apologetics."

Most people might say that this apologetics stuff is fine for priests or theologians or ex-Protestant pastors, but what does this have to do with me? In that statement from the bishop, he wasn't talking to priests, and theologians and ex-Protestant pastors; he was talking to all Catholics. He said that we, as Catholics, have to be able to defend and explain our Catholic faith.

The question I ask Catholics is: "If necessary, can you defend your faith?" If a Baptist were to ask you for scriptural reasons for the Catholic belief in purgatory, would you be able to give him an answer? Could you answer an Evangelical's question on where in Scripture it says anything about the Catholic belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist? Can you explain to a person from the Church of God that praying the rosary is not equivalent to worshipping Mary.

Are You an "APOLOGIST"

You could be, you might be, you probably are and don't know it. Even if you are a senior citizen, middle aged, a teen or a baby boomer, gen x, or millennial, you most likely are an apologist. Now that doesn't mean you apologize for everything all the time according to John Martignoni in his article titled Apologetics Primer. March 01, 2004.

The word *apologetics* is derived from the ancient Greek word *apologia*. An *apologia* was the case a lawyer would build on behalf of his client. So apologetics is about building the case for our faith—learning how to explain and defend our faith.

Donation Requests
