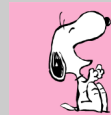

Sometimes we forget about brothers we haven't seen in a while and then when we think about them we wonder where they are. However, life goes on, we get busy and we soon forget and that fleeting thought becomes a distant memory.

Laws and Rules of the Order

The laws and rules of our Order, as well as state laws, specify that the Knights of Columbus may accept insurance applications only from Knights of Columbus members. As a member, you may apply for insurance on yourself, your wife, and your dependent minor children.

The Order's Board of Directors has taken action, though, to assure that a brother Knight's widow maintains the right to purchase additional insurance for a limited time. This can be of great benefit and comfort to those we leave behind.

This "right to apply" is available only to the widows of insured members. If a member has not availed himself of our top-rated life insurance program, or purchased an annuity or long-term care policy, or Disability Insurance; this benefit is not available to his widow.

But if the member was an insured member, his widow has the right to apply for additional insurance on her life and on the lives of the member's minor children. This right can be exercised for up to one year following the Order's receipt of proof of the insured's death.

Know two things:

First, I'll assist your widow and children in any way possible if you should die, both with your Knights of Columbus insurance and any other life insurance you may have.

Second, I'll provide them my best professional advice and service, to assure that they continue to have adequate insurance protection.

Know to whom you are talking. For our purposes, there are two main types of apologetics: Catholic apologetics for non-Catholics and Catholic apologetics for Catholics. The people I have had the most trouble convincing on any given truth of the Catholic faith are not Protestants but Catholics—people who attend Mass every Sunday and who pick which of the Church's teaching they want to believe, just like you would choose or reject items of food as you go down the line in a cafeteria. The term often used to describe such people is "cafeteria Catholics."

Are You an "APOLOGIST" You probably are...

Seven Rules of Engagement continued:

Stay focused. If you have ever engaged a non-Catholic in any serious conversation about your faith, you are probably familiar with what I call the "doctrinal dance." They will ask you a question about purgatory, and, right in the middle of your answer, they will say something like "Well, why do you worship Mary?" As you respond to that, they will say, "Why, do you believe the pope can't sin?" As you explain papal infallibility, they will say "Why do you confess your sins to a man instead of God?" Hence, the doctrinal dance. Some non-Catholics switch the subject whenever you have an answer to their questions. Don't let them do it. Keep bringing the conversation back, in a firm but gentle way, to one main topic until you have said all that you want to say on that topic. Then you may move on.

Donation Requests

Because of the ongoing requests for donations, both through the mail and from the floor at Council meetings, the following procedure to address such requests has become necessary

All donation requests should have supporting documentation that explains their purpose and beneficiaries. This documentation should be presented to the Council Officers for their review. The Council Officers, after review, will provide a recommendation on each request to the general membership at the subsequent Council meeting. The recommendations will be voted on at that time.

This procedure will apply to all mail requests and requests made from the floor. Please remember this procedure if you have a request to be made.

All campers will need to reserve their own site. Go to: www.michigan.gov/dnr

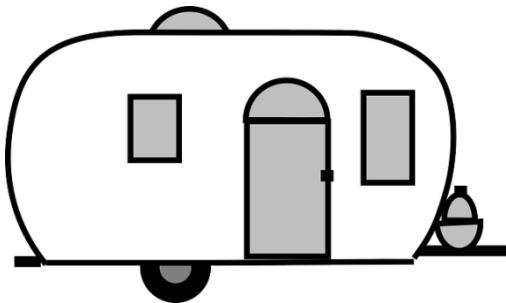
