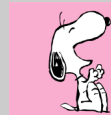

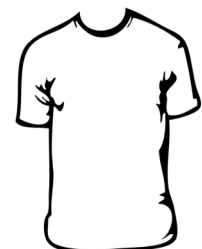
This procedure will apply to all mail requests and requests made from the floor. Please remember this procedure if you have a request to be made.
